Specifically my platform includes the following five points:



Coordinate, integrate, and properly prioritize initiatives to ensure that WFP's field offices are most effective. Improve management efficiencies to maximize the impact of donor contributions.
- ② Expand Global Food Security Today more than 2 billion people lack food security according to the FAO. Whether addressing acute emergency food aid needs or long-term chronic problems of malnutrition and hunger, I will focus on measurably improving global food security issues.
- **O** Expand Cooperative Efforts Develop a multi-faceted strategy with other critical UN agencies, NGOs and bilateral donors to address hunger and food security issues to assure that sufficient resources are available. To be a leader in creating a continuum of care so people move seamlessly from disaster food aid to independence.
- O Develop Innovative Partnerships Continue to expand WFP's base of support to include the private sector on every continent, creating new ways for individuals, corporations and communities to help their global neighbors.


